

BERESFORD BUTTERY TRAVEL GRANT - CONDITIONS

The Beresford Buttery Travel Grant for further training in obstetrical and gynaecological ultrasound has been provided from donations to the Beresford Buttery Fund, to commemorate the outstanding contribution of the late Beresford Buttery to the development of obstetrical and gynaecological ultrasound.

Purpose

To assist the successful applicant to travel to any country for the purpose of making a particular study of any scientific, research or clinical subject relating to the practice of obstetrical or gynaecological ultrasound.

The Grant shall not be awarded for the purpose of assisting the applicant to gain a postgraduate degree.

Eligibility

Open to medical graduates, within five (5) years of award of a Masters or PhD, who are committed to a career providing obstetrical and/or gynaecological ultrasound services in Australia or New Zealand, and who are normally resident in Australia or New Zealand.

Tenure

There is no requirement as to a period of tenure for the overseas visit.

Grant Funds

The Grant shall be used towards air travel/accommodation to and from the place of study to the value of AUD\$5,000.

Applications

Applications are to be submitted using the RANZCOG Women's Health Foundation Application Form (Travel-Based), together with other information as specified on that form.

The date for receipt of applications is 30 June.

Applications are assessed by the RANZCOG Research Grants Committee.

Reporting

The successful applicant shall agree to submit a report on their work to the Foundation within three (3) months of their return. The report will be reviewed by the RGC and the Australasian Society for Ultrasound in Medicine.

Following acceptance of the report by the RGC, the Grant recipient is to submit an article for consideration for publication by RANZCOG. The article should be a lay summary of the study undertaken and why this is an important area of obstetrical or gynaecological ultrasound (maximum 200 words). The article must be submitted by 31 January in the year following completion of the study. The article will be considered for publication in O&G Magazine and may also be used for other promotional uses by RANZCOG.

Acknowledgement

The RANZCOG Women's Health Foundation and the Australasian Society for Ultrasound in Medicine are to be acknowledged in any publication or thesis resulting from work undertaken during the period of study by stating that the author was the recipient of the Beresford Buttery Travel Grant during a particular year. A copy of any published article arising from research carried out under the Beresford Buttery Travel Grant is to be submitted to the Foundation and the Australasian Society for Ultrasound in Medicine when available.

Promotion

RANZCOG may publish details of the Grant recipient and the associated project, including the lay summary, for promotional, educational, or membership activities in all forms of media now known or later developed, including but not limited to, the RANZCOG website, Facebook, Twitter, advertising, presentations, and marketing materials.
