

Advanced Training Pathway: SRH

Elective Module 3: Acute Gynaecology and Early Pregnancy

Curriculum Objective

To provide a framework on which to build expert training in the knowledge, clinical skills and professional attributes required to provide comprehensive high-level services in acute gynaecology and early pregnancy.

Learning Outcomes

At completion of the Acute Gynaecology and Early Pregnancy Module the trainee should have demonstrable academic, clinical and professional skills relevant to comprehensive early pregnancy and acute gynaecological consultation and service delivery, to evidence-based standards, in the context of broader sexual and reproductive healthcare.

The trainee is expected to be able to:

- Conduct early pregnancy and acute gynaecological consultations taking account of the broader social and medical needs of each patient, to jointly make and implement an appropriate management plan acceptable to the patient.
- Demonstrate skills in diagnosing and managing the full range of early pregnancy and acute gynaecological conditions at a level which supports supervision and training of others as well as problem solving for difficult cases including referral where necessary.
