

RANZCOG Trainee Selection Process - AUS

CV/Application Scoring Guidelines - 2024

Important:

RANZCOG will not tolerate false declarations. Information found to be misleading may result in immediate disqualification of the application and could result in a lifelong ban from making future applications. Annually, a minimum of five percent of all applications will be audited. Applicants are obligated to contact RANZCOG if there is any change to relevant clinical experience after the submission of their application.

- ✓ Gaps in O&G rotations must be justified. Eg. Paternal leave, further study, block(s) of non-O&G experience

Documentary evidence required:

- Statement of service or Hospital contract confirming the term of O&G experience
- Hospital appointment letter must be provided for positions which commence after the close of applications.

1.2 Rural clinical experience in O&G in Australia

Criteria:

- ✓ Rural hospitals must be located in areas classified as MM2 or above in the Modified Monash Model. Look up here: Health Workforce Locator | Australian Government Department of Health and Aged Care
- ✓ Experience must be a minimum of 10 weeks blocks at 1.0 FTE (or equivalent). No other denomination of blocks accepted.
 - o For example, 20 weeks at 0.5 FTE would be accepted.
- ✓ Must be within O&G space

Documentary evidence required:

Statement of service or Hospital contract confirming the duration of O&G experience and location.

Points:

0 Points (less than 46 weeks experience) **2 points** (46 to 91 weeks experience)

Criteria:

- ✓ Experience at PGY 2 or above
- ✓ Clinical experience in either Australia or New Zealand.
- ✓ 12 months experience outside of O&G will only be awarded points if followed by at least 12 months O&G experience.
- ✓ Experience must be a minimum of 10 weeks blocks at 1.0 FTE (or equivalent). No other denomination of blocks accepted.
 - a. For example, 20 weeks at 0.5 FTE would be accepted.
- ✓ Clinical work experience outside of O&G must be as a doctor. Points will not be awarded for work experience for other medical professions eg. Paramedic, Radiographer.

Documentary evidence required:

- Statement of service or Hospital contract confirming the term of O&G experience.
- Hospital appointment letter must be provided for positions which commence after the close of applications.

- ✓ Must be 1st author
- ✓ Publication can be on any medical topic.
- ✓ Publication **must** be published or 'in press' i.e. research project was completed and in the process of being published.
- ✓ Articles must have been published in the previous five years prior to application.
- ✓ PubMed (https://pubmed.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov) and/or MedLine (https://www.nlm.nih.gov/medline/index.html) refereed journals only.

Documentary evidence required:

Publication title, PubMed or Medline reference number and URL link to publication. For those in-press, please provide formal notification from the journal/editor-in-chief.

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Category Criteria and scoring

3.2.2 Presentation at a Regional, National or International ASM or equivalent as 1st author only

Points:

0.5 point - one presentation1 points - two presentations1.5 points - three presentations2 points - four presentations

Criteria:

- ✓ Must be 1st author.
- ✓ In person poster, E-poster and oral presentations accepted.
- ✓ There must be a competitive selection process leading up to the presentation.
- ✓ Presentation topic **must** be O&G specific.
- ✓ Presentations that have been accepted and are scheduled to take place prior to start of training, are eligible for points.
 - Must provide evidence that presentation is accepted at time of application.
- ✓ No specified timeframe within which presentations must have been presented
- ✓ Must be different from the work submitted in Section 3.2.1 Publications.
- ✓ Presentations that have been presented multiple times will only be scored once.
- X Does not include hospital meetings or registrar presentation evenings.

Documentary evidence:

Must provide certificate for presentation which states applicant's name, title of presentation and which ASM or equivalent presentation took place.

For those accepted but not presented yet, an email from the conference/organisers needs to be provided.

Category Criteria and scoring

5.1 Rurality – country-based GP, regional rural schooling

Points:

5 points

- Resident, for a minimum of three years during the period of secondary school education in an area classified as MM3* or above
- Minimum of two years as a General Practitioner (GP) in a single area classified as MM3*

3 points

- Resident, for a minimum of three years during the period of secondary school education in area classified as MM2*
- Minimum of two years as a General Practitioner (GP) in a single area classified as MM2*

2 points

 A minimum of one-year full time as a non-bonded medical student in a rural clinical school.

Criteria:

- *MM2 or above in the Modified Monash Model: <u>Health Workforce Locator</u> Australian Government Department of Health and Aged Care
- Only the highest scoring item will be awarded points. Points are not accumulative.

Documentary evidence required:

Supporting evidence must clearly address each of the requirements as per option above.

5.2 Indigenous – Applicants indigenous to Australia or New Zealand

Points:

10 points - The applicant is of Australian Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander, Māori or Pacific descent OR identifies as a person of such heritage and is accepted as such by the relevant Indigenous community.

Documentary evidence of the above is required.

0 or 10 points

Section 5: Rurality and Indigenous Origin maximum 15 points

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6. Outstanding Leadership and Altruism

Criteria:

- ✓ Only the highest scoring activity will be scored. Points are not accumulative.
- ✓ Each activity item must be in dot point form.
- X Lengthy statements that detail past employment, workplace accomplishments and individual aspirations will **NOT** be assessed.
- X Do NOT include Research, Audit, Teaching, Examining, Hospital roles, Professional Development courses or appointments as these can be rewarded elsewhere.
- X Do NOT include items specified in "Examples at Level that will NOT score points".

Documentary evidence required:

- Must be provided for each separate activity item.
- Provide name, date, and duration of time commitment, role/responsibilities undertaken and justify how key principles are demonstrated.
- Late submission of documentation is not acceptable. Activities not accompanied by suitable documentation will be disregarded.

Recognition of Prior Experience (RPE)

Applicants to the FRANZCOG Training Program who have undertaken O&G specialist training overseas may be eligible for points in the Selection process.

Application Process

Applicants will indicate in their online application form if they have undertaken O&G specialist training in a country other than Australia and New Zealand.

Applicant will be required to provide the following documentation:

- A statement or certificate attesting to satisfactory performance in the relevant training program, from the appropriate college or certifying body.
- Evidence of successful completion of written and/or oral examinations in O&G (where applicable).
- Certificate of Registration Status, also known as Certificate of Good Standing or Certificate of Current Professional Status, from the jurisdiction(s) where the applicant is currently practising.

Note: Documents listed above must be attached to your application for FRANZCOG.

Assessment criteria

O&G experience will be considered only if obtained in a recognised training program with comparability to FRANZCOG Training, e.g. the Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists (RCOG) and the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland (RCPI).

The period of formal training must have commenced not more than five (5) years prior to the date of application.
