

# Instructional guide on APSS

This document provides step-by-step instructions to the assessors on how to access and complete the APSS assessment form.

## Access

The trainee will provide you with the form. However, here is the <u>link</u> and additionally below is the QR code to open on a smart device:



## Process of APSS assessment

### 1. Identify the procedure being assessed

Firstly, the trainee is to indicate the procedure in which they will be seeking assessment on. It is important to note that only one procedure can be assessed per form. This can be used as a formative assessment for learning, to assist the trainee to modify their thinking, behaviour or performance for the purpose of improving learning. Moreover, this can be undertaken as a summative assessment of learning, in which case it will contribute to the overall assessment of the trainee's competencies to perform the procedure at the identified stage in training.

### 2. Assign a Level of supervision against each skill

The assessor then indicates what level of input the trainee required throughout the procedure. Please note, mastery implies the ability to perform procedure without needing to consciously review each step. Surgeons who have mastered a procedure use 'muscle memory' for the routine parts of the procedure and tend to be able to complete tasks quicker.

### 3. Provide a Global Rating

The assessor then indicates the overall assessment rating (Global Rating), based on the level of supervision acquired and the assessor judgement.

A general guide regarding making a holistic judgement from observations is as below:

- For a trainee to achieve a global rating of D, trainees would be expected to obtain level 4 in all the key components.
- To reach a global rating of C, trainees would be expected to obtain a level of 3 in most components.
- To reach a global rating of B, trainees would be expected to obtain level 2 in most components with perhaps some level 3s.
- To achieve a level A, trainees would be expected to obtain some 1s and 2s

The APSS form has dedicated space for the assessor to provide feedback or discuss areas for further improvement.
